This project, consisting of amending Permit WW-1-2842 to demolish the existing pool, filter building, and bath house and construct new facilities utilizing the existing connections to municipal water and sewer located at 21 Avenue B in Rutland City, Vermont, is hereby approved under the requirements of the regulations named above subject to the following conditions.

1. GENERAL

- 1.1 The project shall be completed as shown on the plans and/or documents prepared by Jeffrey Budrow, P.E., stamped by the Drinking Water and Groundwater Protection Division on July 28, 2016 with the stamped plans listed as follows:

- 1.2 This permit does not relieve the landowner from obtaining all other approvals and permits PRIOR to construction including, but not limited to, those that may be required from the Act 250 District Environmental Commission; the Watershed Management Division; the Division of Fire Safety; other State departments; or local officials.
- 1.3 The conditions of this permit shall run with the land and will be binding upon and enforceable against the landowner and all assigns and successors in interest. The landowner shall record and index this permit in the Rutland City Land Records within thirty (30) days of issuance of this permit and prior to the conveyance of any lot subject to the jurisdiction of this permit.
- 1.4 This project is approved for the re-construction of pool house and addition to the filter building. Construction of additional nonexempt buildings is not allowed without prior review and approval by the Drinking Water and Groundwater Protection Division and such approval will not be granted unless the proposal conforms to the applicable laws and regulations. No construction is allowed that will cause non-compliance with an existing permit.
- 1.5 Each purchaser of any portion of the project shall be shown a copy of the Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit and the stamped plan prior to conveyance of any portion of the project to that purchaser.
- 1.6 This permit shall supersede Permit WW-1-2842.



- 1.7 By acceptance of this permit, the landowner agrees to allow representatives of the State of Vermont access to the property covered by the permit, at reasonable times, for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with the Vermont environmental and health statutes and regulations, and permit conditions.
- 1.8 Any person aggrieved by this permit may appeal to the Environmental Court within 30 days of the date of issuance of this permit in accordance with 10 V.S.A. Chapter 220 and the Vermont Rules of Environmental Court Proceedings.

2. WATER SUPPLY

- 2.1 This project is approved with the existing connection to the water supply system owned by Rutland City for a maximum of 1800 gallons of water per day.

3. WASTEWATER DISPOSAL

- 3.1 This project is approved with the existing connection to the Rutland City wastewater treatment facility for a maximum of 1600 gallons of wastewater per day.
- 3.2 This project is approved with an existing building sewer line. The Drinking Water and Groundwater Protection Division assumes no liability for the adequacy of this sewer line. Should the line fail and not qualify for the minor repair or replacement exemption, the landowner shall engage a Licensed Designer to evaluate the cause of the failure and to submit an amendment application to this office prior to correcting the failure.
