

**CITY OF RUTLAND, VERMONT
BOARD OF HIGHWAY
WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2016**

Present: Mayor Louras, Commissioner Wennberg, President Notte and City Clerk Heck.
Also present; Building Administrator Tara Kelly, David Zsido, Susan Schribeman, Paul Gallo and a Representative from Weston & Sampson.

Mayor Louras called the meeting to order at 2:25pm.

Renaming Dorr Drive Bridge:

Davis Zsido of 3 Haywood Avenue spoke about his previous request of naming the Dorr Drive/River Street Bridge, the Aldo Manfredi/VFW Memorial Bridge. Mr. Zsido noted that the Dorr name could be added to the new Ripley Bridge as the Dorr/Ripley Bridge. The Board had a lengthy discussion and supported the idea. They were however cautious as to the process and sought to gather input from others that may want to make a dedication as well. The Board asked to take this issue up at their October 26, 2016 meeting. A motion was made and seconded to review proposals presented at that time for naming the new Dorr & Ripley Bridges. **Motion passed.**

Rutland Creek Path-Segment 5:

Susan Schribeman introduced parties of her committee and had the representative from Weston & Sampson present their slide show on segment 5 of the Creek Path. It will be the fourth segment built and extends from the new Dorr Bridge to the College of St. Joseph's. The Board and representatives reviewed the project and discussed an option for approving the use of an 11 foot wide travel lane from the center of the road way. To show the State the City's support, a motion was made and seconded (Louras, Wennberg) to accept the 11 foot road width for the entire length within the projected limit of the project. **Motion passed.**

Enhanced 911

Building Administrator Tara Kelly asked the Board to hear her request about Enhanced 911 and being more consistent within the City, E911 and residents regarding street names and corresponding building numbers. The Board and Ms. Kelly spent nearly an hour discussing what the City is doing and how the process will unfold. Ms. Kelly noted an intern who will work on this issue with her and explained what they hope to accomplish. There were multiple examples related to mis-named or mis-numbered streets discussed. All present were in agreement that the City needs to work on being more consistent with E911 and asked Administrator Kelly to come back to their next meeting with recommended changes so the Board could make motions for approving them.

Meeting adjourned at 4:15pm.
