- Progress on Old Business and Discussions
 - Progress on Accessibility Issues
 - Howe Center
 - Glenn informed the Committee that VCIL would be looking to find a new location for their office due to the roof leaks in the building. The issue would therefore be dropped for the time being.

 - Bob wasn't in attendance so discussion was tabled for next meeting.
 - Party Store
 - Rose hadn't had an opportunity to follow up but would in the next few weeks with a report at the next meeting.
 - Chamber Parking
 - Nate asked that the traffic proposal by the Downtown Partnership be allowed to be presented to the Traffic Safety Committee before the issue is discussed further.

- Nate mentioned that the Public Works Department would try to include it on the work this season if project nearby were constructed.
- Steep incline at Court & West Street
 - The issue was again discussed but no easy solution seems attainable due to grade. Will be examined in the spring for possible solutions.
- Power Doors at Transit Center
 - David reported that they had been installed!
- New Items to be Discussed
 - New Public Works Projects
 - List still in progress and Washington Street lights and sidewalks were mentioned as a possible project to include the curb cut at Pleasants and Washington.
 - Vehicles blocking sidewalk at Wales St across from police station
 - A discussion was held on the issue. It was recommended to be examined in the spring for possible new signing or enforcement to keep the sidewalk clear.
 - Lack of sidewalk snow removal at bus stops
 - The stop at Tremont and Woodstock seemed to be the one of most concern and seemed to be one DPW could alleviate. Nate said he'd ask and see what's happening. Other sites are not the responsibility of DPW and should be followed up with the BUS.
 - Any other new items (Open floor to suggestions)
 - Bardwell crosswalk
 - Gary asked that the CAIR Committee support changes to the crosswalk and traffic timing/allowances at this intersection. The Committee agreed to draft a letter of support and submit it to the Traffic Safety Committee.
